RE: Staff Report on the Morrison County Solid Waste Ordinance Variance Application by Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust

Overview: This is the Staff Report on the Morrison County (MC) Solid Waste Ordinance (SWO) Variance Application by Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust to establish a Demolition Debris Type I facility under Permit-By-Rule (PBR) for Property, 31193 183rd Street, Pierz, MN 56364 – PID# 110201000, and exceed the 500 cubic yard (CY) threshold for a PBR Type I Demolition Facility within MC.

A request by Ms. Diederich for a Morrison County Permit-By-Rule (PBR) Inspection was made, paid for, and the site visit was conducted on April 10, 2017. During the site visit, the building was surveyed for compliance at the County level for the criteria for demolition and disposal of debris by Chuck Parins of Morrison County Public Works Department.

Considerations: It was estimated that this particular demolition project readily has the potential to exceed the 500 cubic yard threshold allowable for a Type I Demolition Facility by the MC Solid Waste (SW) Ordinance. Section 2, Definitions, Subparagraph 2.6, defines a Type I Demolition Facility as:

2.6 "Demolition Facility Type I" A Demolition Debris disposal facility which is designed to hold, and does hold less than 500 cubic yards of Demolition Debris.

The 500 cubic yard (CY) threshold was established to eliminate the disposal of demolition debris at non-permitted facilities, and the potential for out-of-county contaminated waste going to these sites.

On or about April 21, 2017, Ms. Faye M. Diederich provided a written application for a variance to the MC SWO regarding a variance to allow for greater than 500 CYs of demolition material to be disposed.

From the Department assessment, the demolition debris from the Diederich proposal is acceptable demolition debris. With exception of the project exceeding the 500 cubic yard threshold, the general characterization of the waste after removing any solid waste and prohibited items from the buildings, is that substantially all the demolition debris would be acceptable in a demolition debris landfill.

Additionally, because all other provisions would be met for establishing a PBR Type I Demolition Facility within MC and the proximity of the proposed site, enforcement of the 500 CY provision would substantially cause the applicant undue hardship because of economic unreasonableness.

Ms. Diederich's application for variance to the MCSWO is for both exceeding the 500 cubic yards of Demolition Debris threshold for a Demolition Facility Type I in MC, as well as a variance to Section 18, Variances, that requires a variance shall not be granted for a period in excess of two years.

2017 Resolution for Approval of Request for Variance from the Morrison County Solid Waste Ordinance Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust

Whereas, Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust proposes to establish a Permit-By-Rule (PBR) Facility that meets the definition of a Demolition Facility – Type I under the Morrison County (MC) Solid Waste (SW) Ordinance, and

Whereas, Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust appears in all other aspects to meet the eligible criteria and facility location of establishing a PBR Demolition Debris Disposal Facility under MN Rules, Solid Waste Permit Program, Permit-By-Rule (PBR), and under the Morrison County (MC) Solid Waste (SW) Ordinance, and

Whereas, Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust has reviewed complying with the MC SW Ordinance, coupled with an inspection and determination by the MC Public Works Department that this waste will exceed the definition of a Demolition Facility – Type I, and

Whereas, it is the policy of MC to provide the necessary assistance to its citizens, businesses and institutions about the varied aspects of proper solid waste management and disposal, and

Whereas, it is the policy of Morrison County to minimize the land disposal of solid waste and maximize the recovery of waste generated, the County seeks methods to provide for cost effective environmentally sound disposal of waste, and

Whereas, Faye M. Diederich, Faye M. Diederich Revocable Living Trust will be required to comply with all requirements of the MCSWO, as well as meet the MN Rules for Closure and Post-closure, and Required Actions under Minnesota Solid Waste Management Rules for Emergency Response Plan, inspections, closure and 20 years of Post-closure care, and

COUNTY/CLUB TRAIL AGREEMENT

The Agreement is made the _______ day of _________, 20 ________, 20 ________, between Morrison County, hereinafter referred to as the County, and the Morrison County Recreational Trails Association, hereinafter referred to as the Club.

Whereas, the County desires to establish recreational trails for the enjoyment of the public, and,

Whereas, the Club is a registered, nonprofit corporation, willing and able to help the County acquire, construct, and maintain such trails, and

Whereas, the State of Minnesota offers financial and technical assistance to the County for the construction of approved trails,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The County shall apply to the State of Minnesota, Department of Natural Resources for financial and technical assistance in accordance with the laws, rules, and regulations governing such assistance.
- 2. The Club shall acquire the necessary interests in land, construct trails, provide adequate trail maintenance, keep the trails safe for public use, and provide trail modifications as may be required by the State of Minnesota. The Club is solely responsible for the aforementioned obligations, and the parties agree that the County shall have no responsibility, duty or liability for those obligations. Any "work" in connection with the trails shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement between the State of Minnesota and the County, and the terms and conditions of that Agreement are incorporated by reference into this County/Club Trail Agreement and any subsequent contracts between the County and the Club, or between the parties hereto and others.
- 3. The Club shall defend, indemnify, and hold the County harmless from any and all claims brought by anyone arising out of the subject trails, including, but not limited to, claims arising out of the creation, construction, operation, maintenance, supervision, inspection, or use of the trails.
- 4. The Club shall purchase and maintain liability insurance naming the county as an insured, or additional named insured, in an amount at least equal to the maximum liability limits set forth in Minn. Stat. 466.04, Subd.1, currently \$1,000,000 for any number of claims arising out of a single occurrence, and shall provide to the county on an annual basis, a Certificate of Insurance or other document demonstrating that such insurance is in effect.

- 5. The Club shall submit properly completed and executed Landowner Certification forms, Trail Completion Certification forms and Certification of Satisfactory Grooming forms to the County on a timely basis. The certifications must be accompanied by a signed affidavit and sufficiently detailed records to verify that the Club has met the significant benchmarks of "work" on the trails as set by the State. If the County is satisfied that the significant benchmarks of work have been met, it will submit a Request for Reimbursement to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. Money received from the State as the result of these requests for reimbursement will be disbursed to the Club.
- 6. The Club shall maintain books, records, documents, and other evidence relevant to this grant and in such detail that will accurately reflect the benchmarks that have been reached in this program and that have received payment. The Club shall use generally accepted accounting principles and these records shall be retained for six years after this grant terminates. The State, the County its representative, or the legislative auditor shall have the right to examine this evidence and the Club shall make them available at all reasonable times during the retention period. Records shall be sufficient, as defined in the Manual to reflect significant costs incurred and volunteer donation of time, equipment, and/or materials in performance of this grant
- 7. The County shall not be liable for such costs incurred by the Club because State funds are depleted, reduced, or in any way modified. Costs incurred by the Club, which are not reimbursed by the State, shall be absorbed by the Club. In the event that a performance penalty is assessed against the County, by the State, such penalty will be passed through to the Club and shall be the Club's obligation until satisfied.
- 8. The Club will operate as an independent contractor, and neither the County nor the State of Minnesota shall have any responsibility or liability for worker's compensation, other employee benefits, or claims of negligence or other wrongdoing on the part of the Club brought by employees or third parties.
- 9. All trails built and/or maintained by the Morrison County Recreational Trails Association and its member organizations shall be the subject of this Agreement and shall hereinafter be called the Morrison County Recreational Trails.
